## Between two Cultures – Study in Germany, Return and Work successfully in the Home-Country

To study in another country is a great asset, however it is also a big challenge and may trigger a feeling of uncertainty. Living in a foreign country might induce fears, but it is also a chance to see familiar things in a new light and to get acquainted with the unfamiliar environment. Most students adopt this new perspective during their studies in Germany. It is a lengthy process to develop the capabilities to live between two cultures.

It is their wide-ranging experience and the knowledge acquired during their sojourn abroad that make the students the most suitable candidates as future “development aid workers” in their home countries. But to return home is not always that easy.

Upon your return home as a well-qualified professional you are perceived as a ‘stranger’ and you need to first adjust to the old environment once again. Sometimes settling in is more difficult than going to a foreign land. That is why it is so important to prepare your return during your studies.

In this seminar we would like to:

- deliberate about living between different cultures and the feeling of being foreign/local
- inform you about specific steps for preparation for return during and towards the end of your studies
- discuss the problems associated with return
- reflect upon reintegration as a process
- look at the relation between migration and development

Speakers will share their experience with us and we will work in groups and would leave plenty of time for interaction.
