## The Great Sustainable Transformation

Climate change brings enormous challenges for all people on earth. People from the countries of Africa, Asia and Latin America in particular have suffered so far, even though these countries have historically contributed the least to climate change.

If we do not want to exacerbate the climate crisis and avoid warming beyond 2 degrees, rich countries and people in particular will have to make major changes to their lifestyles and consumption patterns in a relatively short time. A "great transformation" to climate-friendly societies is therefore urgently needed.

The energy sector is the largest contributor to climate change. This also includes the building sector as well as the mobility and transport sector.

After the energy sector, the largest amount of climate gases is produced in the food sector, in connection with agriculture and land use. A climate-friendly diet can make a big difference. Planetary Health Diet is a good approach.

Since change always succeeds best when people follow positive examples, in this seminar we want to focus on learning about and discussing successful or succeeding sustainable projects/approaches/policies (best practices).

In this seminar, we will – besides theoretical inputs - mostly work with interactive methods such as exercises and group work.
